Ludwig (Lu ) Carbyn is an internationally recognized wildlife biologist who specializes in the ecology, conservation and management of mammalian carnivores. He is a retired Research Scientist with Science and Technology (Canadian Wildlife Service), and Adjunct Professor at the University of Alberta. Carbyn has published, and edited, 6 books: published over 100 scientific papers. One of his books was short listed as best scientific book in Alberta (1995) and another, published by Smithsonian Books, won The Canadian Geographic's "TOP PICK book" on Wildlife (2004).

His research interests have included avian ecology, ecosystem biology (grasslands), and studies on mammals in western and northern Canadian national parks. He has been a member of the IUCN Wolf and Canid Specialist Groups since 1978. From 1989 to 1993, he headed the Canadian Swift Fox Reintroduction program as chairman of the Recovery Team and continued with the reintroduction project until 1997.

He was President of Nature Alberta and Chairman of the Alberta Chapter of The Canadian Society of Environmental Biologists. Over the years, Carbyn served on numerous Boards of Directors of Academic Institutions and Conservation organizations. In retirement he has

pursued his interest in connecting with aspiring young biologists by teaching a third year University of Alberta undergraduate course in ecology.

Awards included the Distinguished Service Award from TWS (The Wildlife Society), the William A Rowan Award (Alberta Chapter of the Wildlife Society) and Loran Goulden Award (Federation of Alberta Naturalists). In 2013 he received the Queen Elizabeth II Diamond Jubilee Medal for significant achievements for his work on nature conservation in Canada.
